- 49 calls for service 32 were medically related.
- The SLO Fire Safe Council announced last Friday that the hills surrounding Shell Beach, Pismo Beach and Avila will receive half a million dollars in grant funding this spring and summer. This dollar amount was first reported as \$330,000, additional funds have become available. This funding in partnership with CAL FIRE will reduce vegetation using hand crews

- and prescribed burning. The fuel reduction will help better protect our community from a fast-moving wildland fire. We are very appreciative of the Fire Safe Council's investment in our community and the hard work of the Avila Valley FSC working group!!
- Over the next month please watch for your green grass to stop growing and when it does
 please start your vegetation clearance around your home. Please do not wait for the grass
 to be cured as reduction activities could start a fire once the grass is brown. Please do all
 mowing before 11am.

Susan Strachan Reports:

Final EIR now slated for end of year instead of spring release.

Offshore wind: Study to be conducted with Port San Luis, Cal Poly, and City of Morro Bay from grant funding the county received for operations and maintenance facility feasibility. Early in process. Will be public outreach programs developed. Currently working on contract documents. Hoping to bring project to BOS in May for consideration.

Ken Thompson asks who is responsible for fiscal responsibilities? BOOEM looks at financial and environmental aspects of the project.

F. County Parks: Tanya Richardson reports:

- Cave Landing project progressing well with planned ribbon cutting soon.
- The process of "Events" occurring on the Bob Jones Trail was discussed. Requested by engineering firm as fundraiser. A leisurely ride on May 11th. Estimated 100 participants.
- Several events have been requested and County Parks tries to limit impact on pedestrians. Bike events have safety signs etc. in place and volunteers on the trail.
- Farmer's Market starts the first Friday in May.
- Percy Jones asks about permitted participant estimates? 100 riders.
- Ken Thompson asks how Public Works will respond to 300 participants? Public Works will pivot and respond accordingly.

G. Port San Luis: Suzy Watkins reports:

- Cave Landing looks good.
- Staffing up for summer season, fishing and boating. Hiring lifeguards and additional maintenance.
- Hired Executive Assistant and Business Manager.
- Dredging about trailer boat hoist area.
- Continue to work with County and Cal Poly as to Offshore Wind project.
- Requested emergency permit to continue pile driving on Avila Piar to help stabilize areas damaged in storms.
- New Donor Plaque Program allows donors at various contribution levels to have plaques on poles and light posts throughout the pier.
- Matthew Matters asks when the pier will be open further out to the public? The original plan was to wait for completion of the project. However, the Port is considering this as project moves along but work efficiency will be affected to make ready each weekend.
- Matthew Matters asks if the new Donor Plaque Recognition Program is an augmentation to current program? Yes.
- Percy Jones asks, if in summer months, staffing and hours will be increased? Harbor Patrol has no additional staffing due to qualifications

- **Trimmed Trees:** My office recently received a complaint regarding the signs in the pull out along Avila Beach Dr. being covered by overgrown vegetation. Public Works immediately responded and completed the necessary trimming.
- Tree trimming along Avila Beach Dr between San Luis Bay and Ontario, PW will do as much as they can and will request utilities as needed to assist with further trimming.

• Roundabout Groundbreaking:

- April 27th Public Works will be having a small groundbreaking ceremony at the site of the highly anticipated roundabout. The ceremony will not be open to the public given the site's limitations and safety. However Public Works would be honored to have a small number of AVAC members attend.
